






SITE PLAN EXISTING

## OUR LADY OF GRACE CATHOLIC SCHOOL SITE PLAN - PROPOSED



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





#### WELCOME/INTRODUCTIONS:

Jane Dillon-Leitch, Superintendent of Schools and Glenn Clarke, Controller of Plant, welcomed the (PAC) Committee and the Public attendees and outlined the purpose of the meeting at 7:00 p.m.

- 2. <u>OPENING PRAYER:</u> 'Blessing Before a Meeting' prayer was led by Clayton Ferguson; SMCDSB Trustee and was said by all.
- 3. POWER POINT PRESENTATION: A PowerPoint presentation was given to the Georgian West Pupil Accommodation Committee (PAC). Hardcopies of the presentation were available as handouts and can be found on the Board website at <a href="https://www.smcdsb.on.ca">www.smcdsb.on.ca</a> under Community/Pupil Accommodation.

Jane Dillon Leitch, Superintendent of Schools provided an overview of tonight's PAC meeting along with the PAC Recommendations to the Pupil Accommodation Review Committee.

Glenn Clarke, Controller of Plant reviewed the following information:

- Staff Recommendations and key areas for each of the schools.
- Staff Report Purpose and Analysis
- Alternative Site Options for Our Lady of the Assumption Catholic School
- Preliminary Site Design Concepts for OLG addition
- Funding Information

#### 4. **QUESTION/COMMENTS:**

#### Question: Margriet Kempers, OLA

Why was the vote for recommendations not extended to all of the PAC members? Everyone was not given a fair opportunity to vote. I could not attend as I was working and I think my vote should have been considered. I would have sent my vote in by mail or by computer.

#### Answer: Glenn Clarke, Controller of Plant

The vote was to provide an indication; it was used for information purposes only.

#### Question: Margriet Kempers, OLA

The process should involve the entire community to give us a voice.

You are pitting the communities against each other.



Answer: Glenn Clarke, Controller of Plant

It is up to the Trustees to see and hear your concerns. I think this has been a team effort.

Answer: Jennifer Sharpe; Manager of Planning and Properties

The Ministry doesn't specifically look at these reports. Early in the process we talked about the role of the PAC members and the participation at the meeting level. It was made clear whoever was in attendance would make the decisions. This vote was just an indicator through the process.

Comment: Jennifer Robertson, OLG

The two options went forward regardless of the voting numbers.

Comment: Mike Dufort, SMC

This meeting and vote was just about hearing what we had to say.

Answer: Glenn Clarke, Controller of Plant

The four School Valuations were really the key components in the process. We wanted to have open dialogue on everything so we could see the big picture.

Question: Margriet Kempers. OLA

How long has it been since you've received feedback from a real estate agent? Why are you looking at a new site if there isn't any funding available?

Answer: Glenn Clarke, Controller of Plant

We have been in contact with Remax Realty within the last week. Through the process we need to look at new sites. The PAC requested that the Board review new site options for OLA, therefore, we have initiated this process despite current funding availability.

Question: Mike Dufort, SMC

What is the purpose of the internal doors between the classrooms in the drawings?

Answer: Jane Dillon-Leitch, Superintendent of Schools

The doors facilitate supervision. They are used so that the kids can be easily supervised.

Question: Margriet Kempers, OLA

In regards to the larger second story building have you contacted the conservation authority about building a two storey facility?

Answer: Glenn Clarke, Controller of Plant

These drawings are just conceptual rough drawings. They are all contingent upon Municipal approvals, funding from the Ministry, including conservation authority, if applicable, etc.. We would need to have dialogue with the community before going forward.

Question: Kevin Kuiak, POP

How many busses would this proposed site plan accommodate? Is the parking area sufficient?

Answer: Jennifer Sharpe, Manager of Planning and Properties

We have had dialogue with transportation regarding the site plan and the drawing shows the average number of buses required. (4)

Question: Mary Anne Gough, Business Rep. Wasaga Beach Community

How would the students be accommodated during the renovation process?

Answer: Glenn Clarke, Controller of Plant

Considering the impact of construction, the students would need to be accommodated elsewhere, perhaps at Prince of Peace. We would need to have dialogue with the school community.

Question: Theresa Skinner, POP

So are Option #1 and Option #2 still being presented or are they dead in the water?

Answer: Glenn Clarke, Controller of Plant

These options are still alive and are being presented to the Trustees.

Question: Margriet Kempers, OLA

What other concepts are you presenting to us? Do you have other options to show us? Where is the investment in the other options? Who is your real estate agent? I could have a real estate agent find land for you.

Answer: Glenn Clarke, Controller of Plant

If you have any sites available please let us know. We are dealing with Remax Realty. In regards to POP we have had dialogue with the French board about the immediate repairs needed. It is not viable to build a new school for OLA. The plans we have presented for OLG are rough, preliminary concepts that were drawn up by our in-house staff.

Question: Margriet Kempers, OLA

I feel my time has been wasted and this is just the Board's perspective.

Answer: Glenn Clarke, Controller of Plant

Yes, the Staff report is from the Board's perspective. All of the PAC information has also been shared with the Board.

Answer: Kevin Kulak, POP

The Board Staff writes the Staff Report and we are very lucky to have had the Trustees sit in with our Committee and hear our point of view. The Staff report is distinct and separate from the emotional piece. The Trustees can take back all the information with them to present to the other Trustees and then base their decision on these two sides.

Question: Kevin Kuiak, POP

Based on the current financial situation, what if the Government says no to money for OLG renovations? Would the Board put the request in for future request?

Answer: Jennifer Sharpe, Manager of Planning and Properties

Yes, from a Capital perspective, we routinely review our capital needs with the Trustees (approximately annually). We have ongoing communication with the Ministry. Ministry Staff have said we can submit a proposal at anytime for their review.

Question: Martin Mazza, SMC

Would it be problematic that the Staff Report and PAC Report are different? I am sure they would have favoured a more similar Staff and PAC Report.

Answer: Teresa Pinder, SMCDSB Trustee

There has been a lot of work on both sides and there are too many possibilities right now. The process is so complicated and we are limited to the changes we can make. I personally wasn't comfortable after the final meeting and I think we may have needed more meetings. The Trustees will review all of the work and we know this review has been very emotional to many people.

Answer: Clayton Ferguson, SMCDSB Trustee

The Trustees may even choose not to accept any of the recommendations because they may not like the gap between the two reports and then nothing would happen.

- CLOSING REMARKS: Jane Dillon-Leitch, Superintendent of Schools thanked the (PAC) along with the SMCDSB Trustees for their time, commitment and the many hours spent participating in this process.
